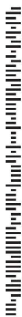

More About the Study

The 9/11 Millennial Study would be conducted by the WTCHR, a program within the Health Department. Participation would be voluntary and strictly confidential.

We would:

- Ask you about your 9/11 experiences and exposures at the beginning of the study, and to fill out one health survey every three to four years
- Protect the confidentiality and security of your data: No one will have access to it unless you give your permission
- Send you occasional invitations to participate in other 9/11-related research studies
- Connect you with 9/11-related health care if you need it
- Publish the study findings so they are available to you, doctors, researchers, policymakers and the public

We Are the NYC Health Department

For the last 17 years, the New York City Health Department has tracked the health of thousands of people exposed to the 9/11 disaster. They voluntarily enrolled in the World Trade Center Health Registry (WTCHR) in 2003-04. Since then, we have learned much about the physical and mental health effects of 9/11 among responders and people who lived or worked near the WTC site. However, we know much less about how 9/11 affected people like you who were children or teenagers on 9/11/2001.

9/11 Millennial Study

Now, we are working with the New York City Department of Education to plan a research study to better understand 9/11 health impacts on young people.

It's called the 9/11 Millennial Study (visit nyc.gov/911health for details).

What we learn from it would give us a deeper understanding of 9/11 health impacts and help improve health care for people exposed to the 9/11 disaster as children.
